MARGARET E. CURRAN



Por almost twenty years, Margaret Ellen Curran has served our community as a distinguished prosecutor in the United States Attorney's Office for the District of Rhode Island. Her outstanding efforts in that office culminated in her appointment as Rhode Island's first woman United States Attorney in 1998.

Ms. Curran entered the United States Attorney's Office in 1986 as an Assistant United States Attorney and beginning in 1990 she was the appellate chief of the office. Since her appointment as United States Attorney, the Office has successfully brought scores of significant criminal and civil cases including the "plunderdome" prosecutions of corruption in the Providence mayor's office. During this busy public career, Ms. Curran has also found time to teach advanced criminal procedure as an adjunct faculty member at Roger Williams University Ralph R. Papitto School of Law.

Ms. Curran received her B.A. degree from the University of Pennsylvania in 1974, a M.S. from Purdue University in 1976, and her law degree in 1983 from the University of Connecticut School of Law where she was editor of the law review. After graduating from law school, Ms. Curran served as a law clerk for the Honorable Bruce M. Seyla of the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit, then as a United States District Court judge in Providence and subsequently as a clerk to the Honorable Thomas J. Meskill of the United States Circuit Court for the Second Circuit.

A native Rhode Islander, Ms. Curran has also served her community as a chairperson of the Rhode Island Zoological Society which raises money for the Roger Williams Park Zoo. Ms. Curran has a keen interest in the Roger Williams Park Zoo and as an undergraduate student majored in biology and worked with wolves and mountain gorillas. A resident of Providence, Ms. Curran is married to Michael H. Feldhuhn and has a daughter, Margy.

Margaret Ellen Curran, you have worked unstintingly in the public service and improved your community in important and long-lasting ways. You serve as an inspiration and example to our graduates, and we are honored to award you this Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

In both the courtroom and the classroom Roscoe C. Howard, Jr. has established a reputation as a brilliant tactician, a powerful intellect, a national expert on the criminal justice system and a dedicated public servant. We are honored by his presence at the Roger Williams University Ralph R. Papitto School of Law Commencement Exercises.

Mr. Howard was appointed and confirmed as the United States Attorney for the District of Columbia in September 2001. Prior to his appointment as the United States Attorney, Mr. Howard was a member of the faculty at the University of Kansas School of Law from 1994 to 2001. While a member of the faculty, Mr. Howard taught courses on criminal law and procedure, authored a text on criminal procedure, supervised the criminal justice clinic and the judicial clerkship clinic and was awarded the Frederick S. Moreau Award as the law professor chosen by the students as most helpful in advising and counseling students.



Both before and during his academic career, Mr. Howard has had extensive and distinguished experience as a federal prosecutor. He first joined the Justice Department as an Assistant United States Attorney for the District of Columbia in 1984. While in that office, he was assigned to the criminal trial division, the felony trial division, the grand jury division and the appellate division. From 1989 to 1991, Mr. Howard served as an Assistant United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Virginia. In Virginia, he handled cases arising from the general crimes section including felony narcotics cases, fraud cases, obstruction of justice cases and public corruption cases. In 1991, Mr. Howard was appointed Associate Independent Counsel in the Office of the Independent Counsel and was lead prosecutor in the investigation of programs, officials, and activities of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. In 1997, Mr. Howard was again appointed as Associate Independent Counsel and served as lead trial counsel in the fraud, false statements, and gratuities investigation and trial of former Secretary of Agriculture Michael Espy.

Mr. Howard has authored numerous works on issues relating to criminal justice and affirmative action. He has also lectured throughout the country on a wide range of topics, such as, the future of the independent counsel statute, the prosecution of white collar crime, the admissibility of expert testimony, police ethics, and the role of minority prosecutors.

While earning a A.B. at Brown University in 1977, Mr. Howard played on the varsity football team. He then received his juris doctor degree from the University of Virginia School of Law in 1977. Mr. Howard married his law school classmate, Deborah Ryan Howard, and is the father of two sons, Ryan and Adam.

Roscoe C. Howard, Jr., your commitment to public service and to the development of the criminal justice system serve as an example to all of our graduates, and we are honored to award you this Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic dress originated more than 600 years ago at the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge, where today, the most colorful gowns in the world are those worn at Oxford functions. Though worn daily in the Middle Ages to identify disciplines of study and to provide warmth, today, academic regalia is reserved for ceremonial occasions.

In the United States, the Academic Costume Code is adhered to by virtually all American colleges and universities. This governs the material, style, color, and trimmings of the gown and hood, the style of the cap, and the color of the tassel.

The field of learning in which the degree was awarded is indicated by the color of the edging of the hood, and in some cases by the color of the velvet trimming on the front panels and the sleeves. The doctor's gown, which may be worn open or closed, has velvet panels draped around the neck and along the front edges of the gown. Three horizontal bars are stitched on the upper arm of the full, bell-shaped sleeves. The standard academic color for law is purple.

This established code allows viewers to determine from the costume the degree, academic discipline and, often, the institution that awarded the degree. The gown of the Roger Williams University Ralph R. Papitto School of Law is black with purple velvet trimming. The hood has a velvet border of purple with a satin lining of a gold background with a blue chevron. The cap, or tam, is worn with a gold tassel.
