

istinguished jurist, you have served the bench of the United States of America with distinction for a quarter of a century. Whatever unexpectedly precipitated your return to your native Puerto Rico, in favor of practicing law in Massachusetts upon graduation from law school, has inured to the benefit of the bench, the bar and the people of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. As a father, a husband, a grandfather, an athlete, a coach and a proud citizen of the Commonwealth, you stand as a worthy example to be emulated by your fellow Puerto Ricans and younger colleagues on the bench and at the bar.



After earning admission to the Puerto Rican Bar, your first position was as a Clerk for the Honorable Pedro Pimentel, Associate Justice of the Puerto Rican Supreme Court. It may have been from Justice Pimentel that you began to form what would become your judicial demeanor, which has been described as "courtly" and "gentlemanly." For several years thereafter, you schooled yourself in the practice of law from counsel tables, first by investigating and litigating labor disputes with the National Labor Relations Board and later, in private practice, where you flourished professionally. To the practice of labor law, you broadened your horizons to include such specialized areas of practice as aviation and admiralty law and other complex civil litigation. You also tried your share of court-appointed criminal cases in federal court. In short, for sixteen years you developed a reputation for excellence that earned you an appointment by President Gerald Ford to the United States District Court for the District of Puerto Rico.

On the then-understaffed bench of the District Court, you faced a voluminous docket of every imaginable kind of case from the very outset of your tenure. For example, it is said that, on one occasion, a criminal trial and a petition for injunctive relief coincided in such a way as to keep your Court in session for a continuous 29 hours. Your decade of service as a federal trial judge was capped by the distinction of sitting for the final two years as the Chief Judge of the Federal District of Puerto Rico.

During the Summer of 1984, President Reagan's appointing you to the United States Circuit Court of Appeals for the First Circuit marked an historic event, for-once confirmed and sworn-you became the first Puerto Rican ever to hold a federal circuit judgeship. In 1995 you rose to become

the Chief Judge of that Circuit Court.

An active and devoted family man, you met your wife, Judy, while in law school and together you have raised four children. An avid reader and well published author, your greatest avocation has taken you to the seven seas. You have competed and coached in numerous international sailing events, including representing Puerto Rico in five Olympic games and traversing the Atlantic twice in commemoration of the 500th anniversary of the discovery of the Americas. As a scholar, you have supplemented your Juris Doctor degree with advanced degrees in public administration and in judicial process. As an advocate for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, you have brought the issue of disparate degrees of citizenship and unequal rights into high relief.

As a member of our profession, you exemplify justice both on and off the bench. For all of these reasons, then, and by the power vested in me by the Board of Trustees of Roger Williams University Ralph R. Papitto School of Law, I am pleased to confer upon you the degree of Doctor of Laws

Honoris Causa.

ACADEMIC REGALIA

Academic dress originated more than 600 years ago at the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge, where today, the most colorful gowns in the world are those worn at Oxford functions. Though worn daily in the Middle Ages to identify disciplines of study and to provide warmth, today, academic regalia is reserved for ceremonial occasions.

In the United States, the Academic Costume Code is adhered to by virtually all American colleges and universities. This governs the material, style, color and trimmings of the gown and hood, the style of the cap, and the color of the tassel.

The field of learning in which the degree was awarded is indicated by the color of the edging of the hood, and in some cases by the color of the velvet trimming on the front panels and the sleeves. The doctor's gown, which may be worn open or closed, has velvet panels draped around the neck and along the front edges of the gown. Three horizontal bars are stitched on the upper arm of the full, bell-shaped sleeves. The standard academic color for law is purple.

This established code allows viewers to determine from the costume the degree, academic disciple and, often, the institution that awarded the degree. The gown of the Roger Williams University School of Law is black with black velvet trimming on each sleeve. The hood has a velvet border of purple with a satin lining of a gold background with a blue chevron. The cap is worn with a gold tassel.
