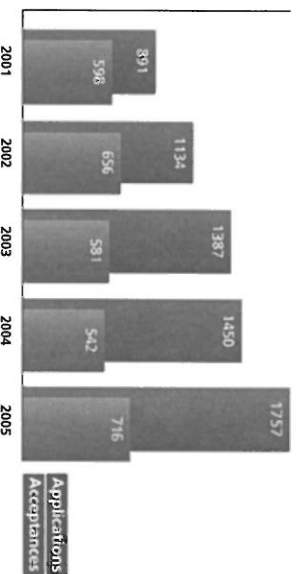

A MESSAGE FROM THE DEAN

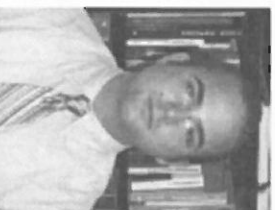
