

### THE HONORABLE LOUIS H. POLLAK



he Honorable Louis H. Pollak, United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, has had a truly remarkable career. Since his graduation from law school over fifty years ago, he has distinguished himself as a practicing lawyer, law professor, law school dean, and federal judge.

Judge Pollak is a graduate of Harvard College and Yale Law School. After graduation from Yale in 1948 he served as a law clerk to Justice Wiley B. Rutledge of the United States Supreme Court. Thereafter, he practiced law with Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison; in the State Department, assigned as special assistant to Ambassador-at-Large Philip C. Jessup; and as Assistant Counsel of the Amalgamated Clothing Workers. It was during this period that he worked on cases as a volunteer lawyer with the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. Most notably, he assisted Thurgood Marshall and his colleagues in drafting the briefs in the seminal

Brown v. Board of Education school desegregation cases, in which the United States Supreme Court declared that racially segregated public schools violated the Constitution. He would eventually become a board member and vice-president of the NAACP Legal Defense Fund.

In 1955, Judge Pollak began his academic career, when he was appointed to the Yale Law School faculty. He served as Dean of the law school from 1965 to 1970, and he left the Yale faculty in 1974 to become Professor of Law and later Dean at the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He distinguished himself as a teacher and scholar of constitutional law, authoring numerous articles and a book on the subject.

President Carter appointed Dean Pollak to the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania in 1978, and he continues his service there, now as a Senior Judge. He is widely regarded as one of the greatest trial judges in the federal system. His colleagues on the bench and lawyers who appear before him marvel at his intellect, fairness, and judicial temperament — one lawyer who appeared before Judge Pollak commented, "He is one of those people that you wish would be on the court forever." Judge Pollak has continued to teach as an adjunct faculty member at the University of Pennsylvania, and over the years on the bench he has been a mentor to dozens of young lawyers who have served as his law clerks and gone on to distinguished careers, particularly in legal education.

Judge Pollak has been married since 1952 to the former Katherine Weiss, and they have five daughters.



or almost twenty years, Gene L. Booth served with distinction as the Executive Director of the Rhode Island Commission for Human Rights, working tirelessly to enforce Rhode Island's anti-discrimination laws in the areas of employment, housing, public accommodations, and credit.

Mr. Booth was born in New Jersey and was nicknamed "the Jackie Robinson of Red Bank, N.J." when he became one of the first black youngsters to play alongside whites in Little League in Red Bank. He later earned an A.B. in Sociology from Dartmouth College in 1957.

Thereafter, Mr. Booth was Director of Educational Programs for Disabled Students in the State Department of Education in Massachusetts. In that role he managed the delivery of educational services to over 2500 special needs students across Massachusetts. Thereafter, he founded Booth Educational Systems, which specialized in developing products and services for disabled citizens, minority groups, and low-income families.



Mr. Booth was named the Executive Director of the Rhode Island Commission for Human Rights in 1983. Despite the steady work of the Commission investigating and adjudicating charges of discrimination, the number of charges filed with the Commission continued to rise. Among Mr. Booth's great accomplishments was increasing the number of cases handled by the Commission, thereby providing timely relief for victims of discrimination.

Another hallmark of Mr. Booth's leadership was his broad advocacy against discrimination, whether based on race, gender, disability, religion, age, or sexual orientation. His efforts to foster respect for what he calls basic "human dignity" have earned him praise from, among others, the NAACP, the National Conference of Christians and Jews, the Providence Human Relations Commission, the Rhode Island Rape Crisis Center, the John Hope Settlement House, and the Rhode Island Labor History Society.

Finally, Mr. Booth has been and continues to be a mentor to countless other human rights workers, community activists, and advocates for justice and dignity. Under his leadership the Commission for Human Rights created a student internship and fellowship program that succeeded in teaching younger generations the importance of human and civil rights. Many former interns and fellows are now working for the cause at the Commission and in other settings. They, and many of the other people Mr. Booth has touched, no doubt share his ultimate dream for the Commission that one day there will be no need for such an agency.

Gene L. Booth, your dedication to public service and your commitment to ensuring equal opportunity for all citizens serves as an example to all our graduates, and we are honored to award you this Doctor of Laws, honoris causa.
