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Planning to attend a conference or have another schedule conflict with a class you are teaching? Class capturing is not just for Distance Learning.

The ITDC has video capturing capability (the Echo<sup>360</sup> System aka Apresso) that allows instructors to record their lecture, and automatically load the recording into their Blackboard course where students can view the material. Instructors can also control when the lecture is available to students in Blackboard. However, students can view the lecture at anytime independent of Blackboard if they saved the weblink.

The video capturing system is easy to use and an instructional technologist is available to assist when needed. Faculty can simply record themselves giving a lecture or include the use of the computer and/or Smartboard technology. One faculty member is currently creating lectures with audio, video, Word™ files and music recordings.

Video recordings for math tutoring are also being created with the use of the Smartboard. The instructor can write out

math equations and formulas on the Smartboard that are captured by the video recordings. This is a great resource for students who have been away from math for a number of years, and need extra help. They can access these recordings to brush up on and review the course material.

Video recording is also good for guest speakers. If you have multiple sections and would like a speaker to present but are faced with a limited time schedule, the speaker can be recorded and the material made available in Blackboard for all sections.

The ITDC is a private area in the Learning Commons where faculty can acquaint themselves with all kinds of technology. Contact Bonnie (x3619) to set up time to review any technology or application you are interested in.
