There are many people at Roger Williams College that have helped all of us in one way or another, either scholastically or personally.




I am both envious of you and thankful for you. Your whole lives are ahead. There are probably many of us who wish that we could be starting off with you.

Soccer Team



Under the coaching of Gil Costa and assistant coach, Jorge Perriera, the Hawks will be back for another fighting season next year.





Dr. M.N. Fulton—A Friend To Many

Dr. Marshall N. Fulton, formerly a student at Roger Williams College, is remembered by those who knew him as being a personable, thoughtful man who had great knowledge qualities. He died on the evening of Monday, May 16 in Denver, Colorado while visiting his mother. Dr. Fulton was the husband of Mary Howe DeWolf Fulton. He lived with his wife on Monkey Wrench Lane in Bristol. Dr. Fulton has been in Kauai, Hawaii. He was 75.

A long time friend of mine, Dr. Fulton was a member of the Roger Williams Board of Trustees, elected on January 19, 1971. Since then, he was Chairman of the Honorary Bequest Committee for three years, chairman of the Building Committee, and the Development Committee, and the Development Committee Chairman. All these committees he had great enthusiasm in his work and they made it a point to attend events of the college.

A Very Busy Man

After graduating from Brown University in 1920 with a Bachelor of Science degree, Dr. Fulton went to Brown University for three years. He came back to the United States and attended Johns Hopkins University. Before he graduated in 1925 with his M.D.

For over 20 years, he practiced medicine as an internist in Providence. From 1948 to 1965, Dr.

Fulton was Physician-in-Chief of the Department of Medicine at Rhode Island Hospital.

During World War II, he was a Colonel in the U.S. Army Medical Corps from 1942 to 1946. He was also Chief of Medical Services at Valley Forge Medical Hospital and Chief of Medical Services at Ashland General Hospital in White Sulphur Springs West Virginia. Dr. Fulton was the chief of the cardiovascular section of Walter Reed General Hospital in Washington and he received the Army's Legion of Merit in 1946.

Reportedly, when he was lecturing in West Virginia, one of the patients was Dwight D. Eisenhower.

Before he retired from practicing medicine, Dr. Fulton belonged to the American College of Physicians for three years. He was also Vice-Chairman of the Board of Governors of the College and President.

Friends Remember

One off the many friends remembers the dispositivo and materials she used to help him. "He was a wonderful person. He will be missed," he said during the service.

Another close friend remembered by saying the Dr. Fulton had a strong sense of humor and irony. They were very well known for it. "He liked people, we had fun with him all over the world."

Another friend said that "nothing was impossible to him." Maybe it was characteristic of where he came from. As far as the college goes, his top quality is that

Two of his favorite hobbies were music and collecting flags. Whenever he traveled, he would collect flags from all of the cities he visited. His favorite type of music

was classical. Reportedly, he picked up a sonata for his father for classical music at Oxford.

Dr. Fulton was also involved with the Michaela Episcopal Church in Bristol where he was a member of the choir. He leaves his wife and eight children, six daughters and two sons, Mrs. Ruth Woods of Denver, Mrs. Robert S. Farn of Hingham,

Mass., Mary Jewell Fulton of Boston, Mrs. Bernard Bissell of Montpelier, France, and Katherine and Holly Fulton, undergraduates at the University of Vermont and Colorado College, respectively.

Ferrycliff Farm Revisited

Ed. Note: The following is reprinted from an article as it appeared in the March 1976 edition of the R.W.C. Alumni Newsletter. The Editor would like to thank the editors of the newsletter for the use of this measurable addition to its magazine.

With the Mount Hope Bridge opening eleven years ago, the Roger Williams College Campus, thirty seven years old, is seen in a brand new setting, one of the most beautiful in Rhode

Island. Its land is on a small cliff that was once part of Ferrycliff Farm, overlooking Mount Hope Bay. The College held the farm until approximately to acquire sixty-three of Ferrycliff's one hundred acres in 1965 from Mrs. Mary Howe DeWolf Fulton and Dr. Marshall Nance Fulton. Although the Bristol Campus is much younger than the College whose beginnings can be traced as far back as 1919 Providence the new campus has a

unique claim to an interesting history of its land.

Ferrycliff Farm dates back to 1977 when the property was purchased and named by Mrs. Fulton's grandfather, Dr. Herbert Marshall Howe who was both a practicing physician and artist. Dr. Howe purchased the land from H.B. Bowler for twenty thousand dollars.

Farm heirlooms dating back to Dr. Howe's time illustrate his devotion to Ferrycliff. An 1893 map marks the boundaries of the property and shows a specimen of trees that were intended to mark the drive of the estate. Dr. Howe had helped to build a new house that was never built. The new house will be built opposite the College pond among a never growth of trees and undergrowth.

According to Dr. Howe's map, the main fields bordering Ferry Road were to be a breeder in 1956 w/ Ferry Road was widened, the family added property to the State to save the trees that once edged the western land. Now part of a medium size, these trees shade Ferry Road and are part of a colorful escapee as one driven by the College approaching the Mount Hope Bridge in autumn.

The Nike Site property and its history is linked to General Burnside whose summer residence once stood southeast of the Site.

Fragments of the house are still standing to the Union General Government of Rhode Island, an United States Senator may still be visited against waves and drifts.

Using the College's main gate an inlet zone can cross Ferry Road to the former estate. The farm's best acreage front Ferry Road leaving an unusable portion west of the new road opposite the Nike Site. This sector has since been sold to a developer while east of it and Metacomet Avenue is the College's northern park, also part of the original farm field.

The Nike Site property and its history is linked to General Burnside whose summer residence once stood southeast of the Site.

FERRYCLIFFE FARM as it was in the early 1960's. The 60 acre farm dates back to 1877. It was a working farm where the usual chores were milking the cows, seasonal cutting and pitching of hay, bringing in corn crops and the general care and harvest of the garden.

THE MAIN ENTRANCE, as it is seen today, was refurbished this spring in the same form as the original entrance looked like in 1893. The map marks the boundaries of the property and shows a specimen of trees that were intended to mark the drive of the estate. Dr. Howe had helped to build a new house that was never built. The new house will be built opposite the College pond among a never growth of trees and undergrowth.

According to Dr. Howe's map, the main fields bordering Ferry Road were to be a breeder in 1956 w/ Ferry Road was widened, the family added property to the State to save the trees that once edged the western land. Now part of a medium size, these trees shade Ferry Road and are part of a colorful escapee as one driven by the College approaching the Mount Hope Bridge in autumn.
