Each day this week will be themed after a different grand prix. Using this guide, you can race along for relevant library resources, quick-fact flags, and information about your library pit crew.

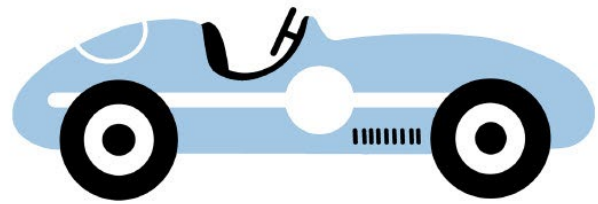

When finished, you can send the pdf to your email or save it on a flash drive. For large files it would be better on a flash drive because the file could be broken up into multiple emails due to the size.

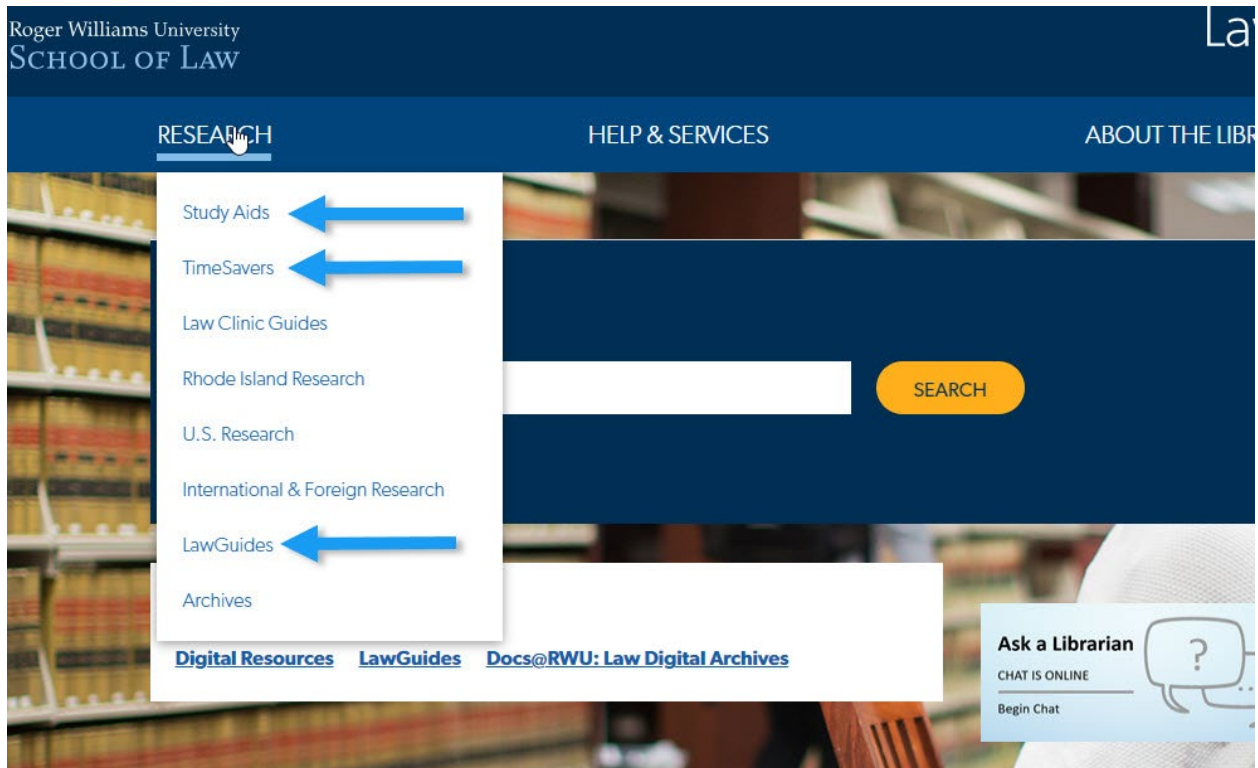
Please follow copyright and don't scan more than 10% of a book or more than a chapter.

[TimeSavers](#) are guides that list materials that may be good starting points for your research, like books, journals, videos, and databases. We have them for negotiations, white collar crime, admiralty, copyright, and more!

If you can't find a guide that suits your needs, please let us know. In the meantime, many other libraries and institutions make similar guides, so you can try to find one that helps you. Google **law guide [your area of interest] site:.edu** to search for guides published by other law schools and universities. Always check to make sure that guide has been updated recently (you can usually find that information at the bottom of the guide page).

## Red Flag



If you have problems printing, especially the second page of your document, try downloading the driver. After you log into HawkPrint, select Driver Print. From there follow the directions supplied based on what type of computer you have. The directions can be confusing and the process can take some time, but the library staff is happy to help. You only have to complete the set-up process once and it should be set for the rest of your time here at RWU.



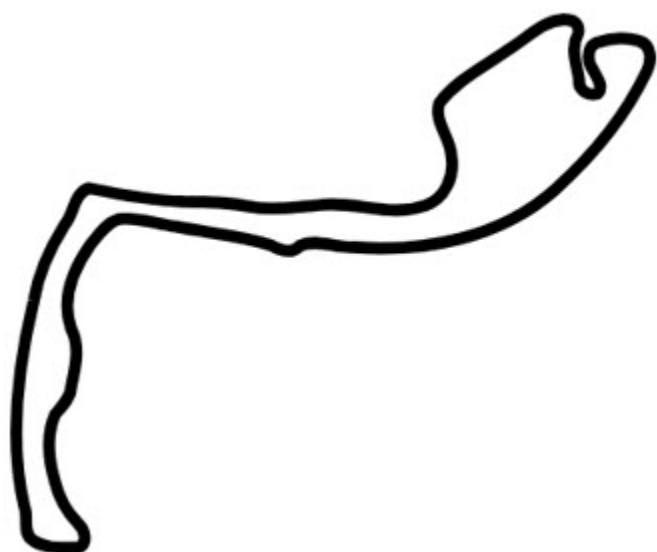



LibGuides, the law library social media, Law Faculty Scholarship digital repository, and the online RWU Law Review editions.

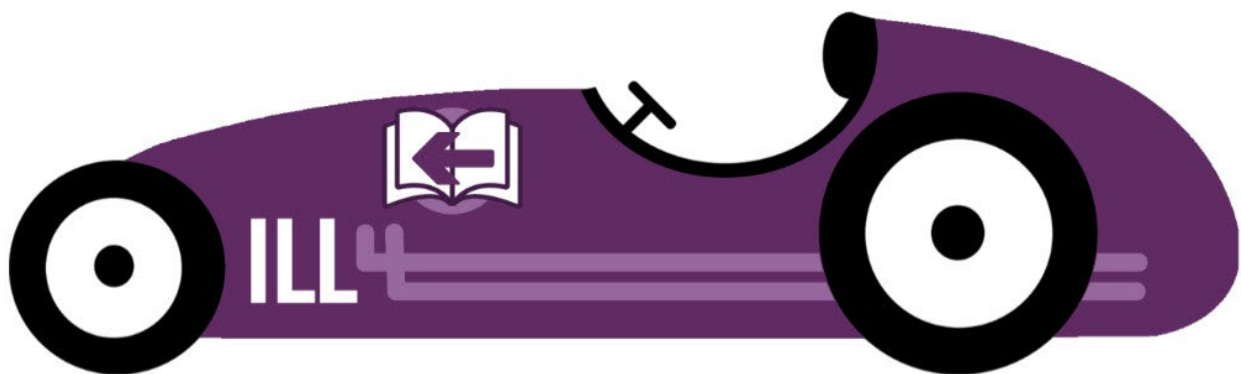

Interlibrary Loan

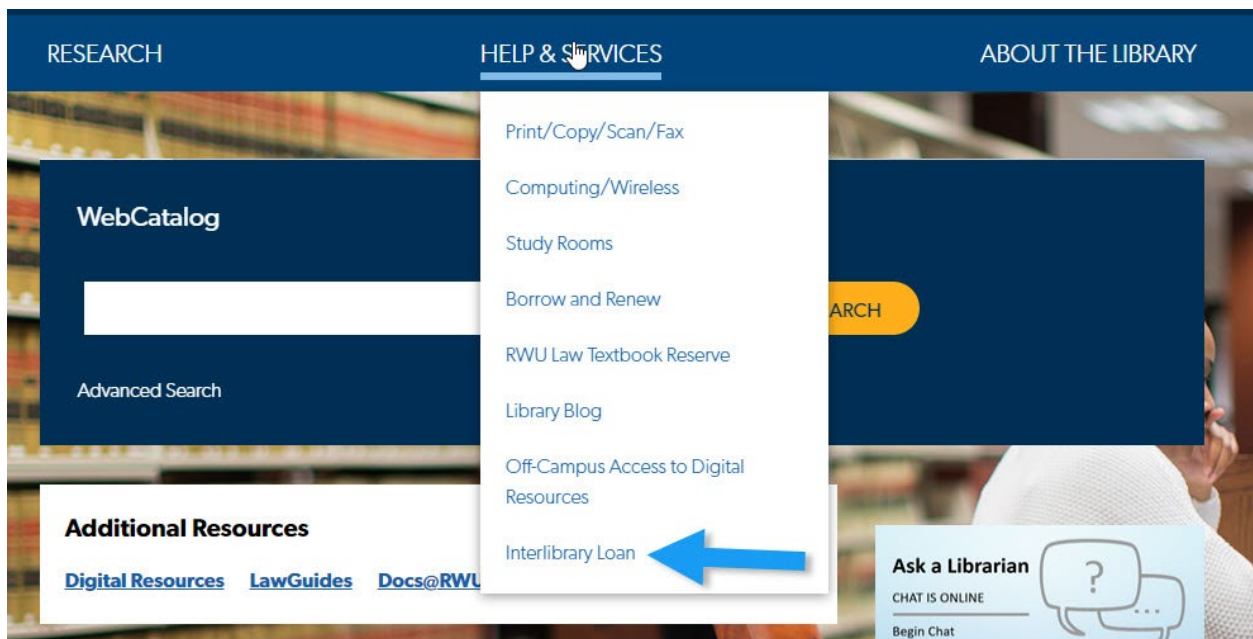


[Interlibrary Loan](#) (ILL) is a service you can use. If you need something that isn't available in ours or the university library's collection, we can request it for you. This is a great resource for research for an assignment or a professor, JMLC, and Law Review.

Books arrive in 1-2 weeks due to shipping and can be picked up at the circulation desk.

Articles and chapter/page requests arrive in 1-3 days and are emailed to you as pdfs.

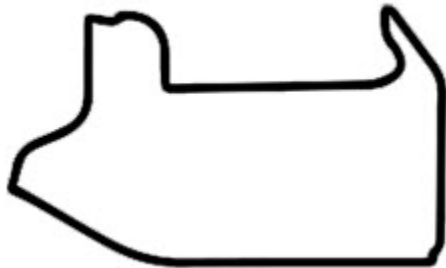

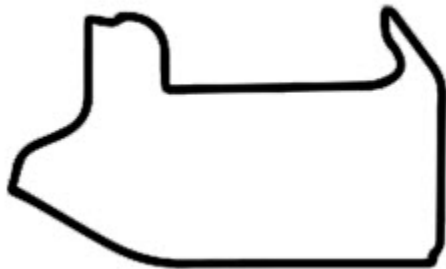
