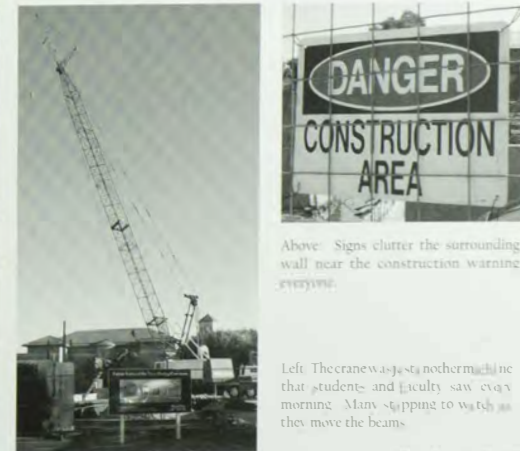

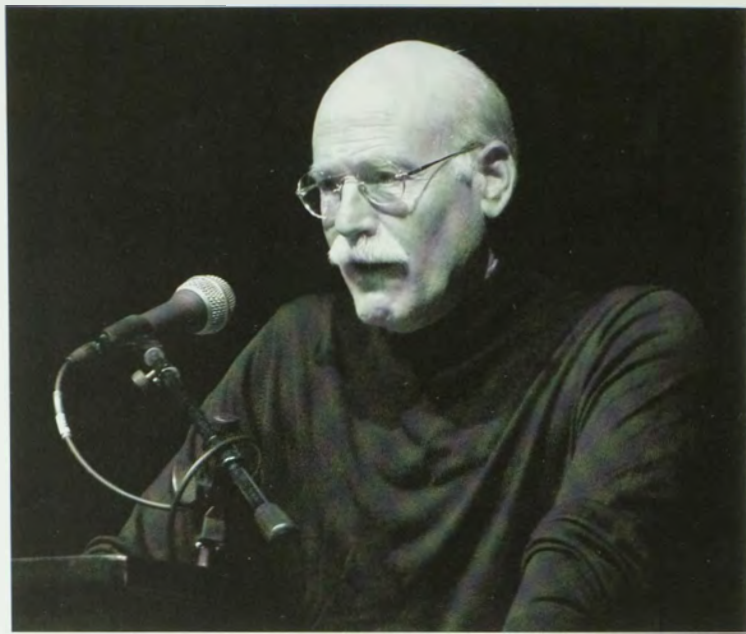

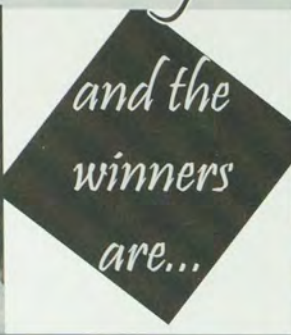

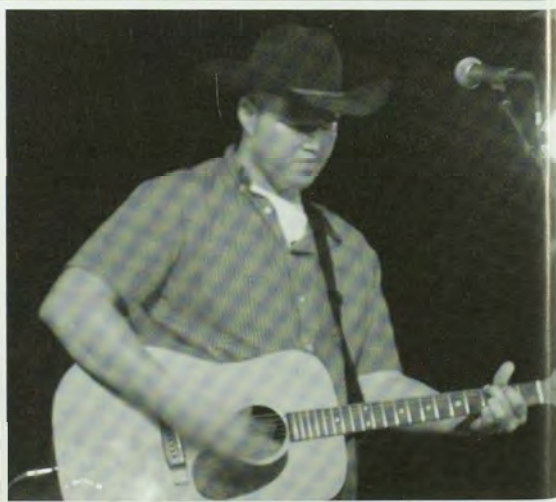

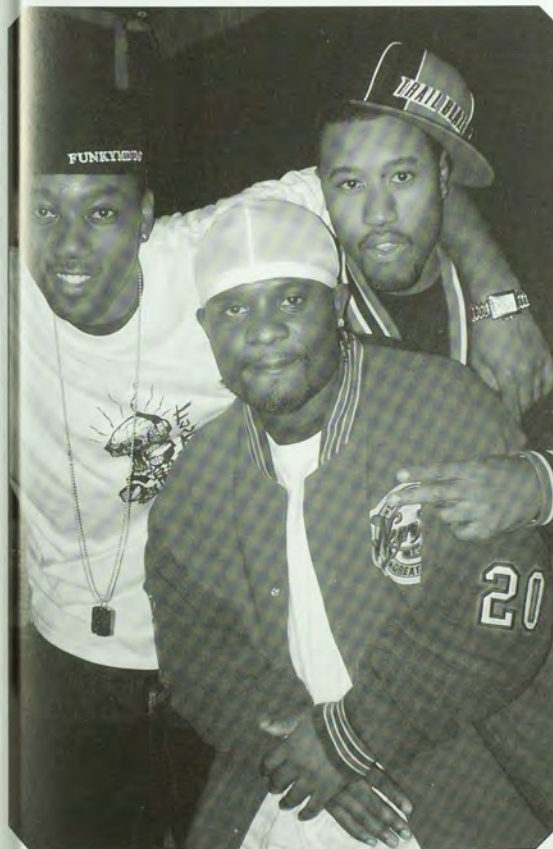

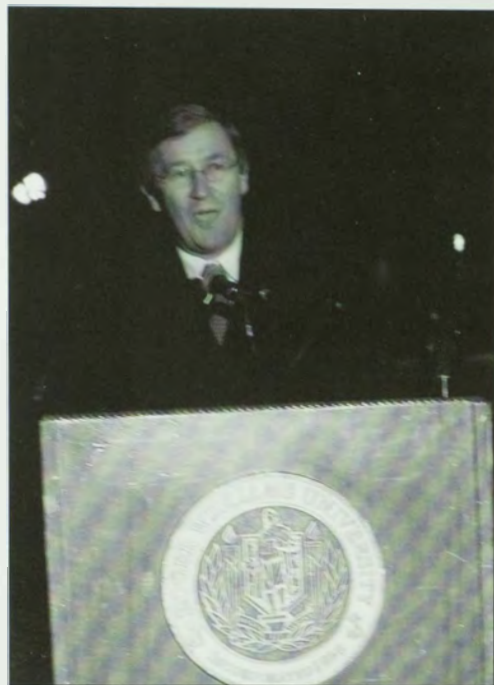

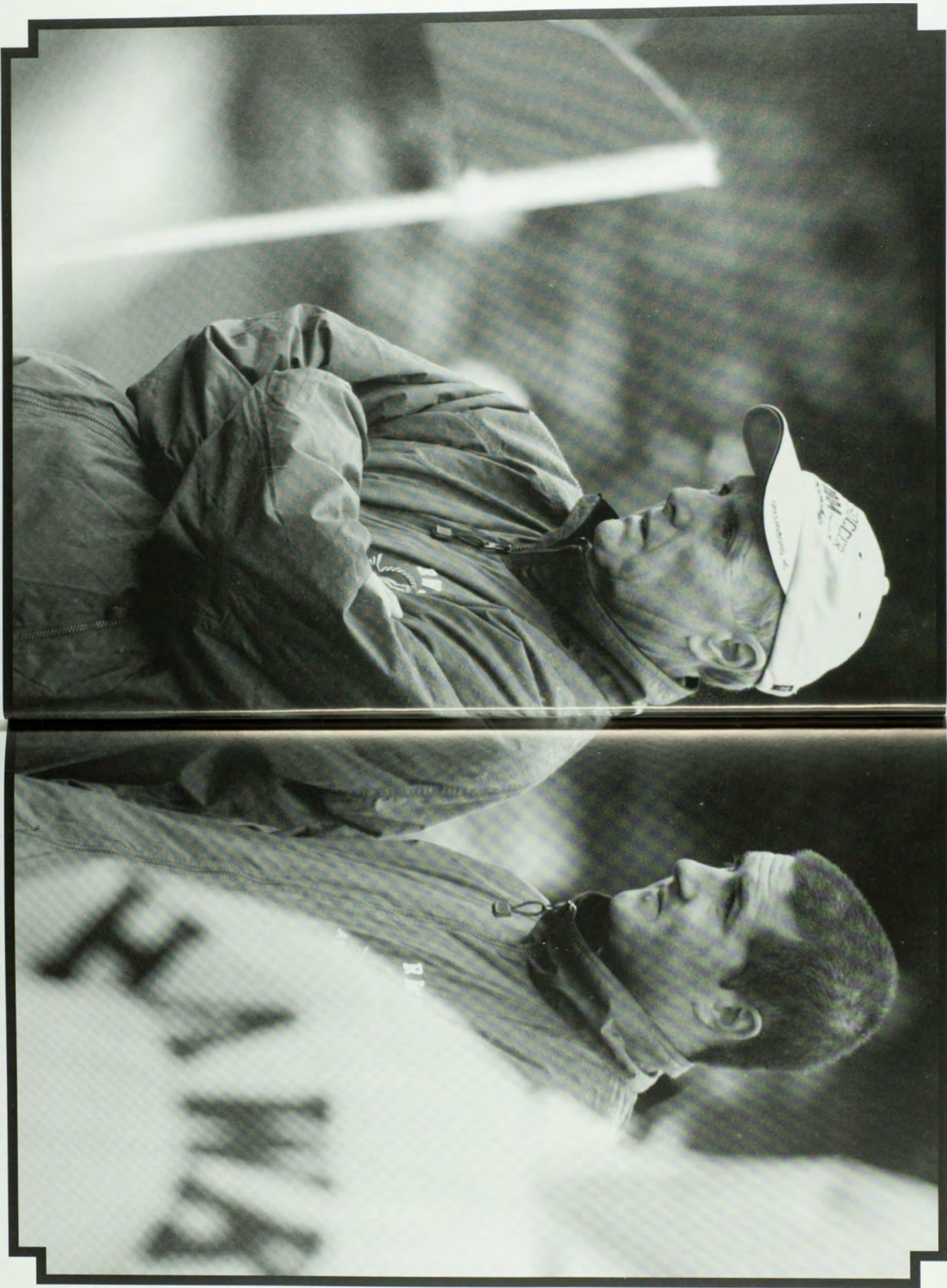

Roger Williams University's roots originate in 1919 when Northeastern University opened a branch campus at the Broad Street Providence YMCA. In 1940, the YMCA Board of Directors took over the school, and, after closing it briefly during World War II, the YMCA Institute granted its first associates degrees in 1948.

In February of 1956, the Institute received a State charter to become a two-year, degree-granting institution under the name of Roger Williams Junior College. During the 1960s, the school, then called Roger Williams College, began granting bachelor degrees and quickly outgrew the Providence YMCA building. The College purchased 80 acres of waterfront land in Bristol and, in 1969, completed construction of its new campus. The College changed its name to Roger Williams University in 1992.

4-Yr. Course Planned By Roger Williams

Plans for the expansion of Roger Williams Junior College into a full four-year institution were announced yesterday by Edwin F. Hallenbeck, vice president for financial affairs. The college currently offers a two-year program.

No specific date for the change-over was set, but Mr. Hallenbeck said it will occur before the college moves to a new, 14-million-dollar campus in Bristol, two years from now.

The expansion has been under consideration for some time, but no definite time arrangements were made public until yesterday.

Mr. Hallenbeck said the new plan must be approved by the secretary of state and the state Department of Education.

At the same time, Mr. Hallenbeck announced that the college hopes to break ground for the 65-acre campus in Bristol within two months.

Originally, the college had hoped to break ground on July 4 and to move to the new site by September, 1967. However, partly because of the current squeeze on construction money, a delay was necessary.

Federal grants totaling \$1,150,000 have been awarded for a complex of four academic buildings as part of the first phase of construction. The grants amount to slightly less than a third of the total cost of the four buildings.

Construction will start when final financial arrangements have been made, Mr. Hallenbeck said. The arrangements will include a loan in addition to the grants announced.

The Bristol zoning board recently granted a variance to allow the first dormitory to exceed the 35-foot height limit of the city's zoning regulations. The dormitory will be the first of three residence halls which will accommodate 300 students each.

An unusual circular building, already nicknamed "the gazebo" by school personnel, will be built near the residence halls.

All Students To Pay More At Jr. College

Roger Williams Junior College will raise its tuition from \$690 to \$790 a year this fall.

At the same time, the college will increase its charges to part-time students. Those increases will amount to \$15 to \$45 per three-credit course.

The tuition boosts were not formally announced. The revised figures, however, are contained in the college's new catalogue, now in distribution.

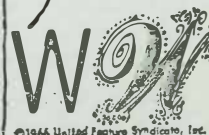
The tuition boost is the first at the college since the fall of 1964, when tuition was raised from \$600 a year to its present level of \$690.

Dr. Ralph E. Gauvey, Roger Williams president, attributed the latest tuition boost to rising operating costs and faculty salary increases. Part of the new revenue, he said, will be returned to students in the form of grants-in-aid. The aid pro-

gram is open to both full-time and part-time students.

Part-time students, effective this fall, will pay \$35 per credit hour. They now pay \$30 per credit hour for day courses and \$20 per hour for night courses. Thus, since the standard college course is good for three credits the increased charges will cost part-time students an additional \$15 to \$45.

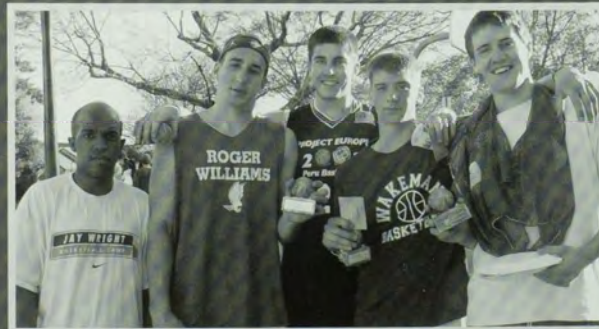
