

Objective: Proposal and proofs of concept for community-driven, municipally supported reconciliation framework structured around engaging, accessible, and educational multimedia presentation of <u>A Matter of Truth</u>

Focus: Particular people (African heritage and Indigenous), places (4 neighborhoods), events (racist mid-twentieth century urban renewal and their legacies)

Outcomes:


- Events (approx. 10, n. 1,500)
- survey (n. 378): need for creative engagement, focus on housing, education, law, economics
- lead stakeholders (n. 16), interviews (n. 30): intentional harm, focus on housing, education, economics
- Creative proofs of concept: website, documentary, promotional video, art installation, soundscape, augmented reality rooms and tours
