Mandell To Chair RWU Law Board

Prominent Rhode Island attorney Mark Mandell unanimously elected to serve as the next chair of RWU Law's Board of Directors.

Mandell has been unanimously elected to serve as the next chair of Roger Williams University School of Law's Board of Directors.

Mandell will be formally seated at the board's next meeting. He succeeds the **Honorable Joseph A. Weisberger '92 H (RWU), '97 H (RWU Law)**, retired Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Rhode Island.

Mandell, a former president of both the Rhode Island Bar Association and the Association of Trial Lawyers of America (ATLA), sat on the Rhode Island Supreme Court Ethics Advisory Panel and has served on the Governor's Advisory Commission on Judicial Appointments, among many other posts. A longtime supporter of RWU Law, Mandell not only teaches trial advocacy at the school, but also sits on its advisory board and in 2008 joined its Board of Directors. In addition, he is the proud father of **Zach Mandell '11**, a third-year law student at Roger Williams; and last year he was welcomed onto Roger Williams University's Board of Trustees.

"I've always believed in the Abraham Lincoln approach to law," Mandell said. "You do it with honor and integrity, you represent your clients as zealously as possible, and you give back. It's great to make a living, but the thread that winds through all of it is serving the public good."
