Dear Mrs. Baker,

Which the "memoir" on Cafacet
which I had promised to send you "soon"
is at last in the post office here at Brook-
haven, I fear that it will not go out until
Monday afternoon, June 16th.

To explain, the "even terms of our sojourn"
were abruptly (and pleasantly) interrupted
by the arrival of our elder daughter and her hus-
band from San Francisco, that of their
daughter and husband from Oakland (we had not
met him), with their daughter (11 months old),
our first great grand daughter!

Had I tell you that "Red Rock Valley Farm"
which is mentioned in the essay, was the one
where my grand parents lived for years in North
Adelphi, Mass. and where they raised their
children, including my father. The name comes
from the color of the soil and rocks, which
contains iron. I remember it well, visiting it
as a boy, though after my grandfather's death
