Coyne '06 on AG Workload

PROVIDENCE, January 6, 2012 – Mondays are **Terence M. Coyne [RWU Law '06]**'s busiest days. On this morning in early December, the prosecutor has a 12-page calendar to conference with Superior Court Judge Susan E. McGuirl.

Court doesn't officially start until 9:30 a.m. but by 6:30, Coyne, one of six lawyers in Attorney General **Peter F. Kilmartin [RWU Law '98]**'s Domestic Violence/ Sexual Assault Unit, has already stopped at a Dunkin' Donuts in Johnston, wolfed down a breakfast sandwich and is at his desk in his tiny cubicle of an office on South Main Street. Kilmartin is looking to hire more lawyers and support staff at a time when the governor is looking for budget cuts.[...]
