July is also the time for one of America's top outdoor shows, the <u>Newport Folk Festival</u>. This year's lineup is typically eclectic, and features some favorites of mine, including Sharon Jones and the Dap Kings, Andrew Bird, (RI's own) the Low Anthem, the Averett Brothers, Calexico, and the Preservation Hall Jazz Band!
